Jenna Wright, guest speaker: "Five Lessons I Learned Making My First No-Budget Short Film."

Jenna wrote an directed a short this past May, which she hopes to turn into a feature. She is from Rochester, worked at Fox studios and lived in L.A. for three years. She decided to move back to Rochester to pursue her work out of the studio system. An experienced writer with no directing or producing experience, Jenna shared the lessons she learned with the attendees.

- 1. If you're shooting exteriors, always have a Plan B.
 - Jenna was plagued with weather problems (rain, cold, etc.). The shoot was all EXT., and were it not for a nearby barn to shoot in, with minimal script revision, the short would have been scrapped.
- 2. Storyboards/shot lists are invaluable.
 - Knowing what you want to get before you arrive on set saves considerable time.
- 3. To be a good and competent director, speak your mind.
 - Jenna noticed that she had a harder time telling her crew what to do in the beginning of the shoot. Once she took command and stated directly what she wanted, operations seemed to flow much smoother.
- 4. Don't be afraid to ask for anything.
 - The more you have to work with, the better your production will be. Asking for things will get you what you need more often than not, and the worst thing you'll ever hear is "no."
- 5. Don't wait... Make your movie.
 - Nobody is going to come to you, offer to make your movie for you. You have to make it yourself. Set a date and go!
